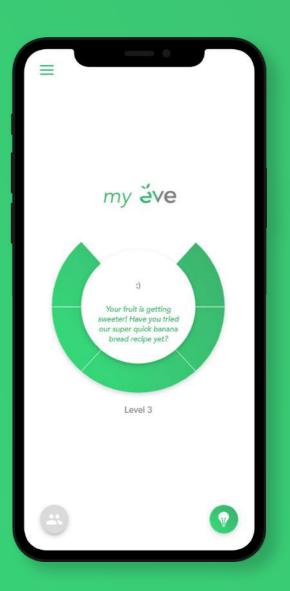

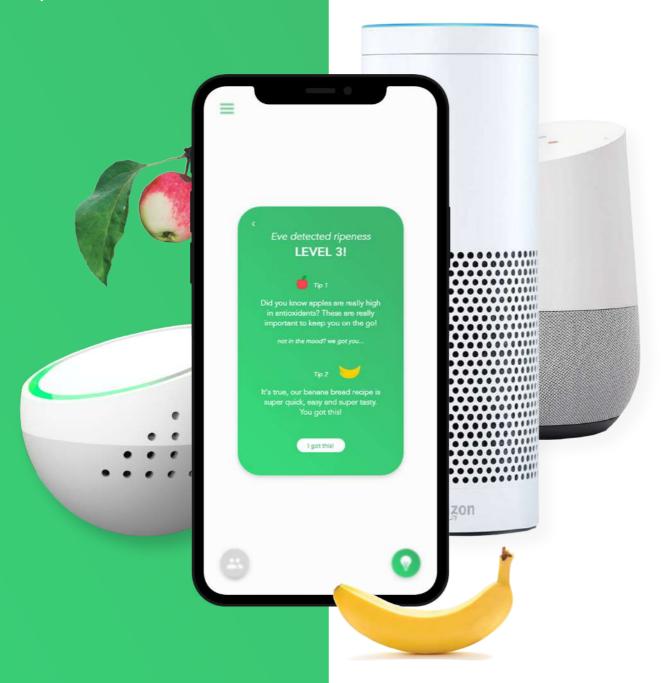

eve is a comprehensive sensor-based solution for preventing fruit waste. Eve involves a sensor that detects fruit ripening within a fruit bowl and wirelessly communicates this information to household members so they know when to use their fruit before it expires. Eve consists of an apple-sized device that visualises ripening through a continuous ring lighting system.

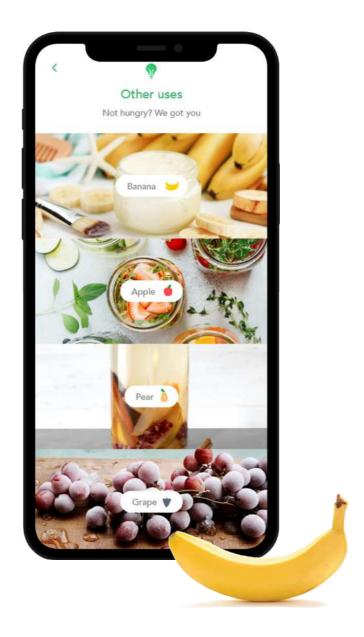

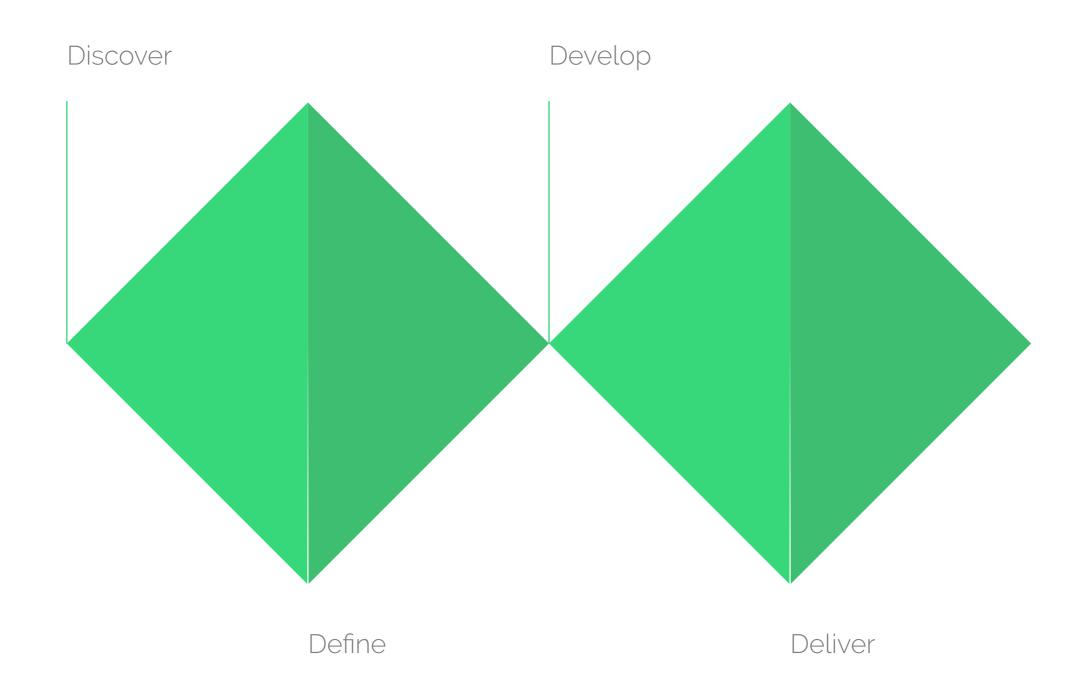

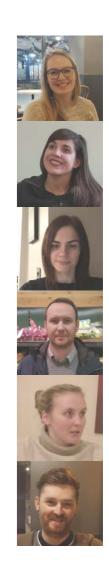

Say fruit and vegetables are their most wasted food type.

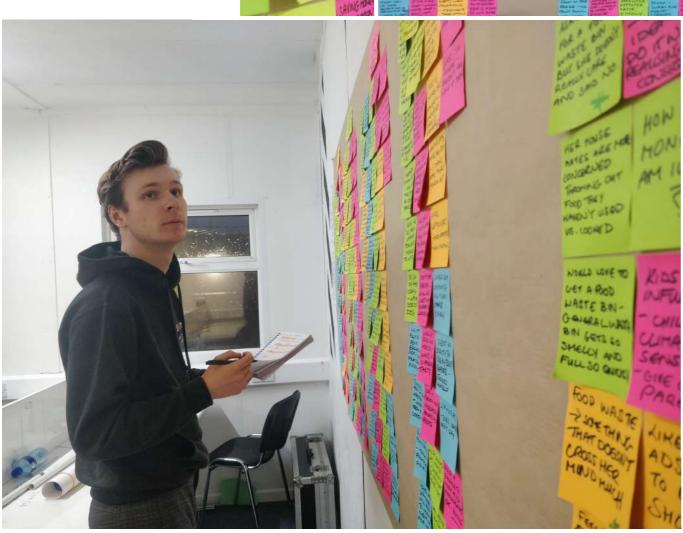

#### **Define**

#### Intention Vs. Reality

The urban person desires a healthy, trendy lifestyle. They do a weekly shop every weekend without a structured meal plan. They shop for the perfect week they aspire to live leading to an abundance of fruits & vegetables bought with hollow intention.

#### Impact:

This 'new week, new me' mentality results in food waste of fruits & vegetables that are neglected when the person chooses the comfort option in the instant, they need something to fulfil their desire.







#### Power of appearance

The urban person has a perceived standard of what 'fresh' looks like. Influences from peers & social media create a false reality of how food should look building higher standards for them as they aspire to follow their online personalities.

#### Impact:

The urban person is more likely to neglect perfectly usable food that doesn't look as fresh. This judgement is primarily based on appearance and again, returns to their access fresher substitutes.

#### Anxious overbuying

The urban person feels more pressured to buy fruit & veg when shopping out of fear of judgment from others on the contents of their basket. They buy more fruit & veg to balance their basket content ratio of healthy to unhealthy food.

#### Impact:

The urban person is far more likely to choose the comfort substitute over the fruit or veg at home. Why? It was bought from their desire as opposed to their perception of what others think they should be eating.

#### **User Story**

As Susan, I need a convenient, accessible way to help me reduce the fruit I waste so I can lower my environmental impact while also saving myself money!

#### **Key Scenario Of Use**

Informing people. like Susan, the rate of expiry at which their fruit is ripening while also encouraging the implementation of a healthier diet into a busy lifestyle.

Due to Susan's busy work-centric lifestyle, she finds it hard to manage and use the food she buys but doesn't want to reduce the variety of fruits in her diet.

#### **Urbanisation**

Food waste already comprises 50 to 70 percent of municipal solid waste in several Chinese cities, including Beijing and Shanghai. (Smartcitiesdive, 2019)

68% of the world's population will live in cities by 2050. (UN, 2018)

In Ireland, purpose-built apartment blocks are excluded from the free brown bin policy due to the government viewing them as commercial properties. (Irish Government, 2017)

#### Fruits & Veg

Fruits & vegetables have the highest wastage rates globally of any food type at 40-50%. (UN, 2018)

In the U.S., the fruits and vegetable market segment claimed 39.4% of the revenue share in 2018 and is expected to only increase its share due to the increase of health-conscious consumers. (Grand view, 2018)

#### **Sustainability**

A recent survey carried out by Forbes in the U.S. market showed 77% of individuals wanting to learn more about sustainable lifestyles. (forbes, 2019)

However, there is an evident say/do gap with sustainability in people's lives. If consumers can see how much money they can save through food waste prevention they will reconsider.

#### Ireland

Ireland wastes 1 million tonnes of food annually 51% of this food waste comes from the household segment.

Irish households waste about 33% of the food they buy.

This costs Irish households on average between €400 to €1000 annually. 1050,2016

#### **Target Market**

My target market is urban apartment dwellers.

Apartment blocks are excluded from the free brown bin policy.

There are 172,096 total apartment blocks in Ireland.

This dwelling segment is the highest growing in Ireland with a rate of 15% over recent years. (CSO, 2016)

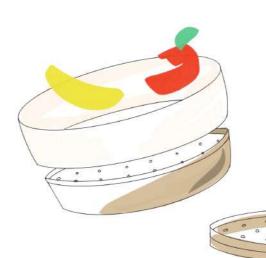


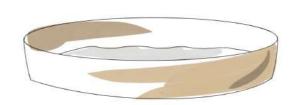




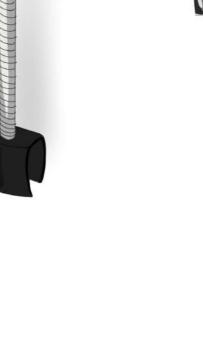








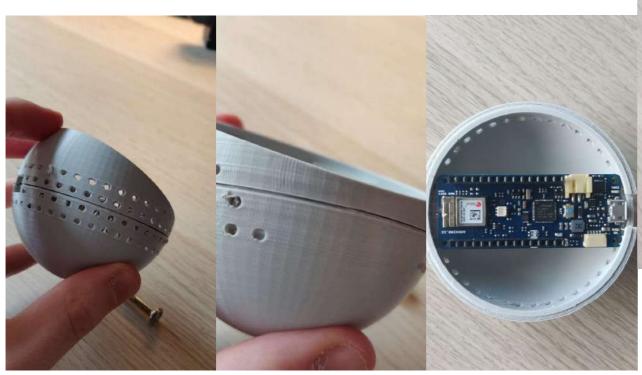

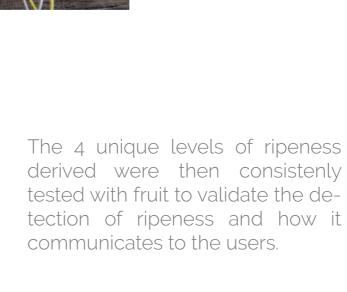


The form of eve is to mimic the size of an apple. The 3D printed prototype developed from multiple iterations and assembly options. Finalising the form, eve was developed to minimise parts and to optimise assembly on the z-axis.

Prototyping

To validate my concept, I tested daily for 7 days the ripening output of 'an average fruit bowl'. The results enabled me to define 4 unique ripening output ranges to correlate with the LED ring display.



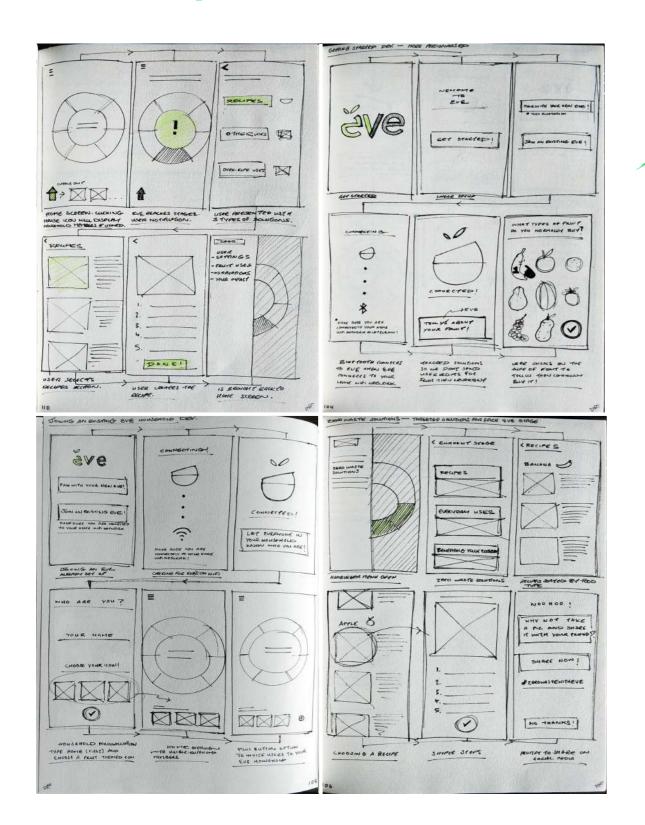


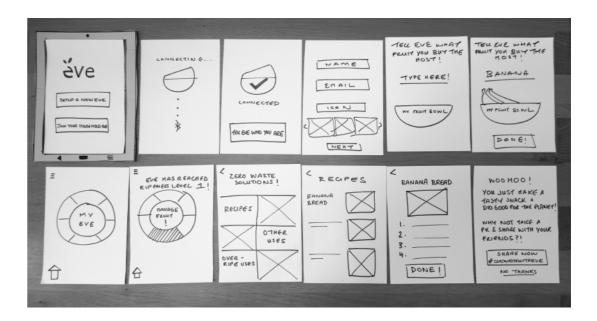
Validation testing

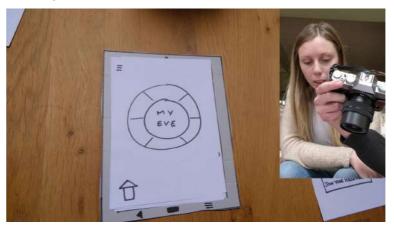




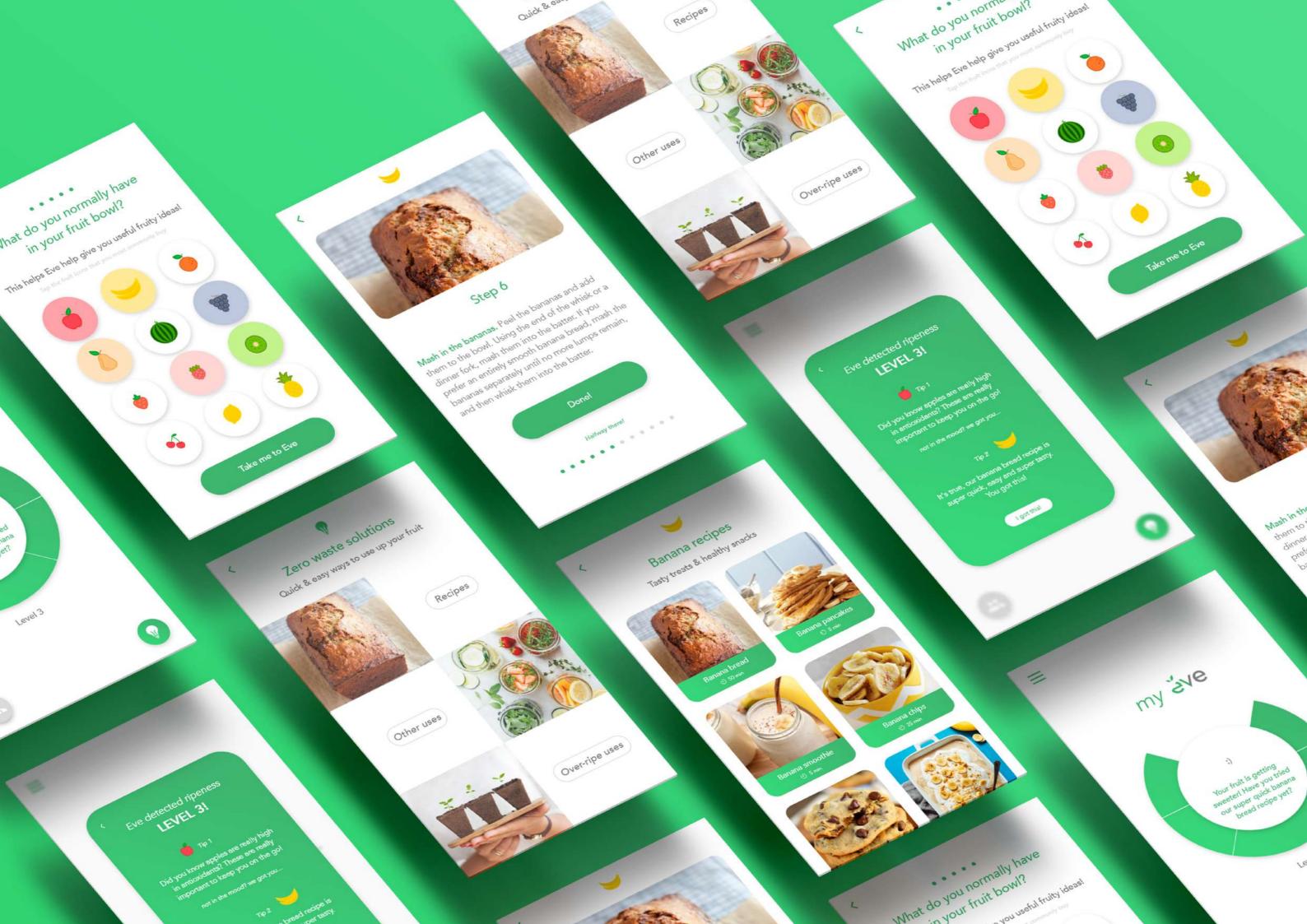

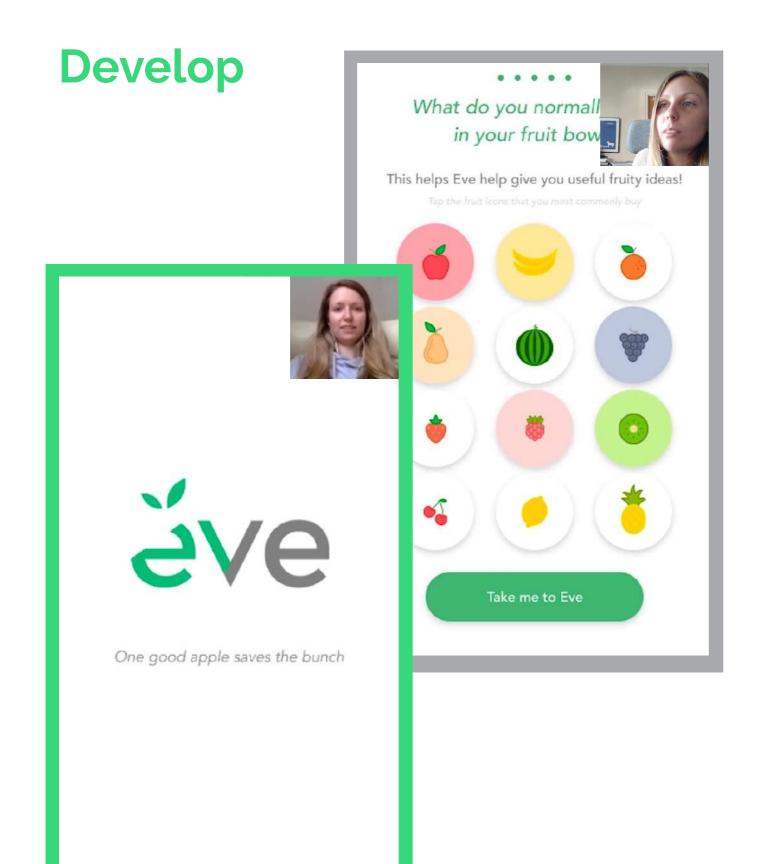
